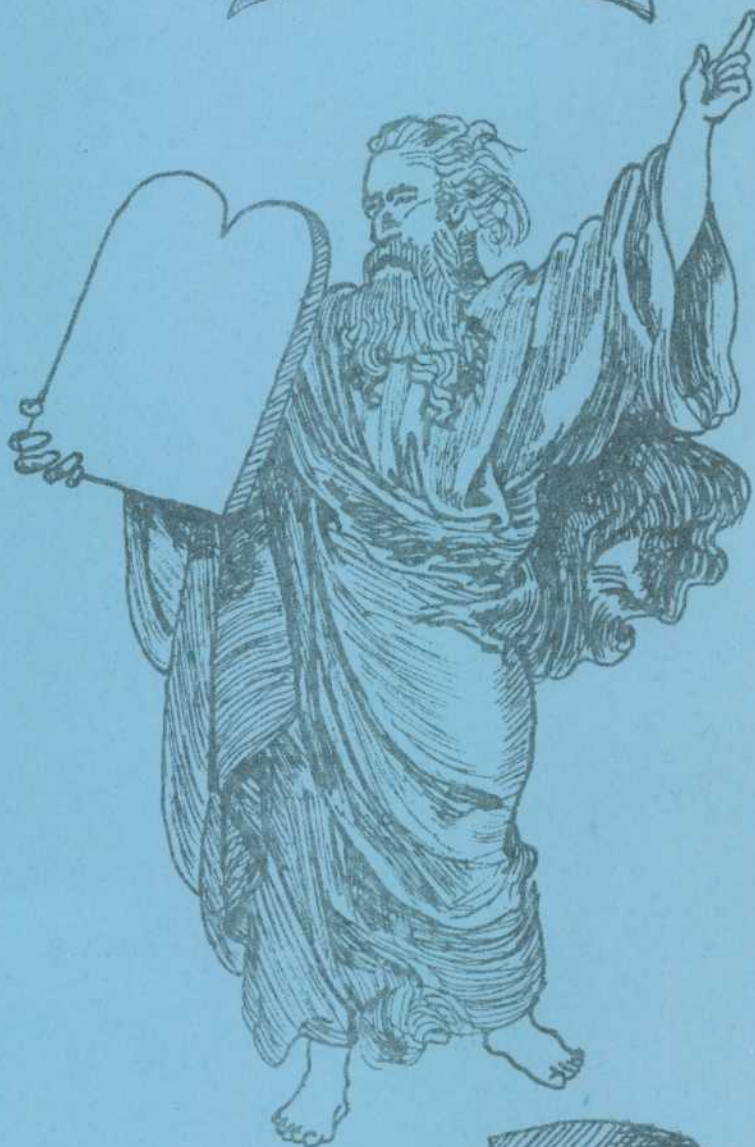

Shalom and Emet have been the hallmarks of Jewish consciousness since the **אבות**. Avraham sought peace with Lot; Yaakov insisted on Emet with Lavan and with his own children. These **מדות** characterize the Jewish nation, the heirs to the legacy of the **אבות**.

When **בני ישראל** came out of **מצרים**, their leaders helped to forge a people that would be **ממלכת כהנים וגוי קדוש**. To successfully fulfill their historical mission **מאור לגויים**, these two attributes were crucial and indispensable.

As the **מדבר** between Jews ensured the **שלום**. Aharon's ardent and untiring pursuit of **שלום** throughout the wanderings in the **אחור** of **כלל ישראל**; **אוהב שלום**; nations model of altruism, it was not sufficient that **אהרן** be **שלום**; he had to go out and involve every Jew in **שלום**. He was the fitting leader for the **בית המקדש**, which stood as a beacon of **שלום** for the world, and which would later be built by **שלמה** - a king who had not known war - in a golden city that itself was called "the city of peace" - **ירושלים של זמננו**.

אמת: the unwavering commitment to truth and justice that is the avowed attribute of lawgivers and judges. The thoughtful and unbiased transmission of the **תורה** sets **מטה** above all prophets and judges, for he was **אמת** personified. The Torah - compared to blue water - was given to **משה** in **סמי** also blue. Although sometimes callous and cold, pure intellectual analysis must consider only hard facts, applying the strict letter of the law. Without **אמת** there is no trust amongst men and peoples, and it is the shared heritage of all mankind. To be **מקדש** **סמי**, we must be ethical and truthful, for that is the supreme in moral behavior. The Torah, which is **אמת**, was given **דף** who is **אמת**, through his prophets, who are **אמת** **אלוקא קטוש**, **אורייתא קטוש**, **נביאות קטוש** (**ברוך סמיה**).

Whereas the mind appears to be the center of **אמת**, it is the heart that is the sanctuary of **שלום**. The metaphor is complete with the perception that a person is human only if he or she has both. We cannot be computers, nor emotional sympathizers alone. **כלל ישראל** must synthesize the two - to create a nation of **כהנים** that employs both intellectual and emotional faculties in awakening the world to G-d's moral law. Each and every member of **כלל ישראל** must strive for this challenging yet lofty goal (**זוהר ויקרא יב**): **"אמת ושלום קטיר דא בדא"** (**זוהר ויקרא יב**): **"Truth and peace are intrinsically connected."**

PRESENTATIONS AND PROJECTS

SHIELD: The shield should embody symbols associated with the themes of the teams and is to be presented on Wednesday night. It is to be constructed of wood, mounted on two poles, and will eventually be permanently mounted in the Dining Room. The *Shield* will be judged on the basis of the following: artistic appeal, quality of workmanship, representation of theme, originality of concept, creativity, and presentation. The presentation is to consist of a detailed explanation of the *Shield*, and how it expresses the theme. Each presentation should not exceed two (2) minutes.

BANNER: An oaktag banner is to be designed and executed exclusively by Machzor Aleph campers. It is to express the campers' concept of the theme. The *Banner* will be presented at lunch on Wednesday.

THEME PRESENTATION: Each team will present its theme in the form of one or more of the visual arts (song, drama, dance, multi-media performance, pantomime, cantata, etc.). The Dramatics and Education staffs will be available for consultation. Each presentation should be approximately 7-10 minutes. Any team exceeding the time limit will be penalized accordingly. They will be judged on the basis of creativity and presentation. Camper involvement should be encouraged. This presentation will take place Wednesday night. All scripts must receive approval of the Coordinating Committee prior to production.

DINING ROOM DECORATIONS: Creativity, adherence to themes, aesthetic appeal, durability and camper involvement will guide the judges. Each team is to prepare one set of table decorations, one *pitgam* to be mounted by Wednesday evening and one other dining room decoration. On Thursday, after lunch each team will present its dining room decorations in a brief presentation to the judges.

SHIRIAH: Each team will present three songs: A *Himnon*, a *Shir Tefila*, and a team march. The *Himnon* must consist of original Hebrew lyrics. The songs will be judged on the basis of presentation which includes: Knowledge of words, harmony, clarity of words, delivery, lasting value, and overall appeal. The *Himnon* will also be judged in the category of quality and relevance of original lyrics. *Shiriah* will take place Thursday evening.

CAMP PROJECTS: Small projects, enabling the team to make a lasting contribution to **MORASHA** will be assigned to the teams by the Coordinating Committee.

ART PROJECT: The art project is to embody the concepts of the theme. It is to be chosen to enhance a specific area in camp. Any form of media may be used, but both the media and location must receive the prior approval of the Coordinating Committee. Staff members may advise and supervise. The execution of the project itself, however, must be done only by campers. The project may be mounted before presentation but must be mounted by the end of Color War Thursday night. All art projects must be completed by the deadline. It will be judged on the basis of representation of theme, originality of concept, artistic beauty, use of media and suitability of location. Presentation of the project shall be judged separately.

SHEALTIEL: The *Shealtiel* will consist of a set of questions, made up for campers based on theme *Sheurim* during color war. Each team will select one boy and one girl per division to compete.

BERACHOT BEE: Each division will be tested for color war points as follows: All divisions: *Al Hamichya, Asher Yatzar, Borei Nefashot*. Nitzanim: *Brachot on thunder, lightning, and rainbow*. Shtilim: *Modim deRabanan*. Ilanot: *Modim deRabanan, Retzeh*. Alufim, Alufot, and SDP: *Modim deRabanan, Hamapil*.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR COUNSELLORS

- 1) COUNSELLORS MUST FIRST FULFILL THEIR RESPONSIBILITIES TO THEIR BUNKS BEFORE PROCEEDING TO MORASHIA EVENTS.
- 2) It is the major duty of all counsellors and generals to encourage all work to be done by campers. Counsellors are to serve primarily as advisors.
- 3) No articles are to be removed from the "A" building, H.C. Huts, Dining Room, Arts & Crafts shops or Merkazia without prior permission from those in charge. All items removed with permission, must be returned to their proper places.

REMEMBER ALWAYS: Stress is not on competition for competition alone can arouse ill feelings and resentment. Emphasis should be on the themes delineated and sportsmanship. All activities should be conducted with the spirit of good fellowship rather than with a feeling of rivalry. The maxim of Morashia stresses the fact that the important thing is not so much to win, as to compete to the best of your ability. Therefore, all counsellors are requested to make certain that all campers, no matter how weak in athletics, shall participate. Any infractions of this rule will result in a substantial loss of points for the team involved.

Bunk cleanup follows the regular rotation schedule. Any departure from maximum standards by campers or staff will be penalized. Cabins will be spotchecked during the day and evening in addition to the morning.

Bunks *MUST* be covered during the morning cleanup, rest hour, evening preparation, and bed time. Responsibility for this coverage will be divided among the teams such that each team will be responsible for a set number of bunks. A copy of this schedule is to be presented to each H.C. and to the Coordinating Committee each morning. Severe deductions will be made for any bunk left uncovered.

Campers must be supervised at all times. Decorum must be maintained in the Dining Room. Campers not participating in certain sports events should be assigned to other activities.

Individual judges may recommend an award or deduction of up to five (5) points per incident for attitude, spirit, sportsmanship, supervision, etc.

Discussions and protests of controversial decisions should never be held in the presence of campers.

In the Bet Knesset, campers and counselors will sit by bunk. Baalei Tefila will be chosen according to the regular rotation. No camper or counselor may absent himself/herself from Tefila without special permission from the Head Counselor and the Coordinating Committee.

STRUCTURE OF THE TEAMS

1) Camper captains may be chosen from each division, and may be involved in planning and decisions.

2) Counselors, as well as campers, are members of their respective teams and will be so judged.

3) Each team is advised to designate staff members from each campus to serve as Coordinator in the following areas: Art, Sports, Track and Field, and Swimming. The Art Coordinators are to submit requests for all art supplies to the Coordinating Committee at Tuesday breakfast.

GENERAL RULES

ENTRIES: Complete written lists of starting and substitute participants in events must be submitted to the judges before the start of the event. If entries are not submitted on time, the event may be forfeited at the discretion of the judges. Entries may be changed only upon the consent of the judges. Any camper may be barred from participation in events by the medical staff.

LINEUP: The lineups and various assemblies will be judged for their orderliness, discipline, promptness, and spirit.

DINING ROOM: Relaxation is essential during mealtime. General decorum must be maintained and the teams will be judged accordingly.

O.D.: The O.D. schedule will follow regular rotation. Generals may make substitutions only with permission of the Head Counselors.

REST HOUR: Rest hour will be strictly enforced. No camper will be excused from the bunk without the permission of the Head Counselors.

LETTER WRITING: Each camper must write home Wednesday. Letters will be collected at supper lineup. Points will be deducted from any camper who has failed to write home.

SHALHEVET: Each team must submit ten (10) articles (one per division) for Shalhevet by Wednesday lunch.

CHANGES: All activities, rules and regulations are subject to change without prior notice at the discretion of the Coordinating Committee. However, this will not be done unless an unusual circumstance indicates the necessity for such a change.

FORFEITS: Teams must be ready on time when the event is called or forfeit said event.

PRORATING: A modified prorating system (Olympic scoring) will be used for all sports except where otherwise noted. 20% of the points will go to the winner. The remainder of the points will be divided on a per-cent basis. In general, the following will be the total point value for each sport:

NITZANIM.....	30
SHTILIM.....	35
ILANOT.....	40
ALUFIM-ALUFOT.....	45
S.D.P.....	50

In case of shut-outs, or wide point differences, certain adjustments are made in the prorating system. The Scoring Committee may be consulted for details.

CURFEW: CAMPERS AND COUNSELORS ARE NOT PERMITTED TO STAY UP AFTER CURFEW, NOR ARE THEY TO ARISE BEFORE REVEILLE, WITHOUT SPECIAL PERMISSION FROM THE HEAD COUNSELORS AND THE COORDINATING COMMITTEE. A limited number of campers and counselors may be allowed an extended curfew. Their names *MUST* be submitted on a special curfew extension form to the Coordinating Committee and the H.C.'s by 7:30 p.m. Names should be listed in order of preference. Extended curfews will be for *one hour only* unless otherwise specified.

PROTESTS: Protests must be submitted in writing, signed by the counselors supervising the activity, and countersigned by the General. The protest is to be submitted to the Arbitrating Committee by the mealtime immediately following the event in question.

PREPARATION and PROMPTNESS: Teams must report to activities promptly. All campers in the division must be present at the activity of their division (unless the camper is taking part in another supervised activity). Failure to be prompt may lead to the forfeiture of points. Participants should wear, wherever and whenever possible, the team color.

MEALS: No camper, counselor, or General, is to be absent from any meal without the prior permission of the Head Counselor and Coordinating Committee. Therefore, no food is to be removed from the Dining Room and no meals may be brought out.

ATHLETIC ACTIVITIES - RULES AND REGULATIONS

1) BASKETBALL

- a) SDP Banim, Alufim, and older Ilanot Banim: 20 minute running halves; all others: 15 minute running halves. The last two minutes of each half in all groups will be played stop time.
- b) Every team member must play at least three minutes.
- c) If time runs out, the game is official after at least one half of the game has been played.
- d) Each team has three time outs a game, each lasting one minute.
- e) One and one goes into effect on the sixth team foul within a half.
- f) A player fouls out of the game on his/her fifth personal foul.

2) SOFTBALL

- a) SDP and Machzor Bet - 6 innings; Machzor Aleph - 5 innings
- b) A minimum of three full innings will constitute a game.
- c) Each team member must play in the field at least one inning and have at least one turn at bat.
- d) A person who is "substituted out" may not go back into the game.
- e) No inning may begin less than five minutes before the end of the period.
- f) Prior to the game, the counselors and the judge must review the particular ground rules of that particular field, in accordance with the accepted practice of that field, e.g. ground rule double if ball goes into bushes etc.
- g) Throwing the bat is an automatic out; no sliding

3) VOLLEYBALL & NEWCOMB

- a) A team must win two out of three to decide the match.
- b) 15 points are needed to win the game. A team must win by two points.
- c) Each team member must play at least one full game.
- d) Net ball on a serve is out, a ball on the line is good, the pole is out, no double taps, maximum three taps, if the ball hits the net it counts as a tap.

4) BASKETBALL SHOOT

- a) Each team shoots simultaneously from either side of the foul line with the shooter retrieving his rebound and passing the ball back to the next shooter.
- b) The first team to score ten (10) baskets wins.
- c) Team must win two out of three shoots.

5) HOCKEY

- a) Time: two twenty minute halves; running time
- b) Where needed, the judge must mark the creases in front of the goal nets periodically during the game.

6) MACAHANAYIM AND DODGEBALL

- a) Standard camp procedure for these activities, which must be discussed by the counselors and the judge before the game, will be in effect. It is recommended that all games be played, all balls live.
- b) Two out of three games will decide the winner: all three games must be played.

7) PUNCHBALL AND KICKBALL

- a) Seven innings constitute a game. A minimum of five innings must be played.

8) TENNIS

- a) One set decides the match. No player may appear in more than one set.
- b) A ball on the line is good.

9) BBV

- a) Seven inning game, the shot at the basket counts as soon as the ball leaves the shooter's hands.

10) ARCHERY

- a) Each player shoots seven arrows from 30 ft. away. Point distribution 7-5-3-1.
