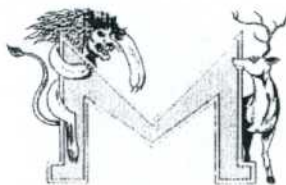

Each activity, a team will be responsible for the cleanup of all the fields and courts. This team will also be responsible for picking up and returning the necessary sports equipment.

Points will be deducted for improper cleanup. Below is the schedule of which activities each team is responsible for:

NOTE:

THE ARI TEAM SHOULD WEAR ORANGE OR LIGHT COLORS WHILE THE TZVI TEAM SHOULD WEAR GREEN OR DARK COLORS.

ATHLETIC RULES AND REGULATIONS

1) BASKETBALL

- Machon Banim, Alufim & Ilanot Banim: 20 minute running halves; all others: 15 minute running halves. The last 2 minutes of each half in all divisions will be played stop time.
- Every team member must play at least three minutes.
- If time runs out, the game is officially over after at least one half of the game has been played.
- Each team four time-outs per game.
- "One and one" goes into effect on the seventh team foul within a half. Two shots on the 10th foul per half.
- A player fouls out of the game on his/her fifth personal foul.
- One team will be responsible for keeping score and fouls; the other team will keep time.
- Overtimes will be 3 minutes, 2 minutes running, last minute stop time.
- All technical fouls will result in two foul shots and possession of the ball.
- For scoring purposes, a 30-point victory is equivalent to a shut-out.

2) BBK

- Seven-inning game.
- The shot at the basket counts as soon as the ball leaves the shooter's hands.
- A minimum of four innings with three outs each must be played.

3) FOOTBALL

- There will be two twenty-minute running halves.
- Three completions is a first down. Only one first down per drive.
- Last two minutes of the game, the clock stops for an incomplete pass, out of bounds, or change of possession.
- The quarterback cannot go over the line until the referee has audibly counted a seven-Mississippi rush.
- If time runs out, a game is considered complete after one half of play.

4) HOCKEY

- Time: 3 eight-minute periods. Machzor Bet Boys play 3 ten-minute periods.
- Games are official after half the game has been completed.
- One three-man, three-minute sudden-death overtime will be played if needed, followed by a 3 man shootout.
- Each team receives one time-out per game.
- Each team member must play at least three minutes per game.
- All boys must wear athletic supporters.

5) KICKBALL

- 7 innings constitute a game.; a minimum of 4 innings with 3 outs must be played.
- Substitutions follow the same rules as softball.

6) DODGEBALL AND PIN DODGEBALL

- Standard camp procedure for these activities - which must be discussed by the counselors and the judge before the game- will be in effect.
- Three games must be played.
- Games should be played with all balls live.
- Substitutes may only enter at the beginning of a new game.
- Each team member must play at least one game.

7) SOFTBALL

- Machon and Machzor Bet - 6 innings; Machzor Aleph - 5 innings.
- A minimum of three full innings will constitute a game.
- A maximum of 10 players will play the field. All team members will have a spot in the batting order. Team members will rotate in the field.
- Each team member must play in the field at least one inning and have at least one turn at bat.
- No inning may begin later than 5 minutes before the end of the period. The inning must be completed.
- Prior to the game, the counselors and the umpire/judge must review the ground rules of that particular field, in accordance with the accepted practice of that field, e.g. ground rule double if ball goes into bushes, etc.
- Throwing the bat is an automatic out. The umpire will have discretion as to what is considered a thrown bat.
- Machzor Aleph - Tagging up from third base only. Machzor Bet - Tagging up from any base.
- The catcher must wear a mask at all times.

9) TENNIS

- In order to win a set, a team must win 10 games; one set wins the match.
- A ball on the line is good.

10) VOLLEYBALL & NEWCOMB

- A team must win two out of three games to win. All 3 games must be played.
- 15 points are needed to win a game. (Nitzanim & Shtilim Newcomb play 11 point games.) A team must win by two points. Dead at 21.
- Each team member must play at least one full game.
- Net ball on a serve is out, a ball on the line is good even on a serve, the pole is out, no double taps, maximum three taps, if the ball hits the net it doesn't count as a tap.
- A player cannot put a foot into other team's court. A player's hand can cross over the net only:
 - To follow through on a legal hit,
 - To block an opponent's shot after the opponent has hit the ball. Touching the net is never allowed.

PRESENTATIONS AND PROJECTS

I. GENERAL PROJECTS & COMPETITIONS

BAKE-OFF: Each team must choose five Machzor Aleph campers, and assign a counselor to supervise the group in the Baking Room. Each team will receive a pre-baked cake from Rena Emerson. They will have 1 hour to decorate the cake using raw materials provided. The bakeoff will take place at 4:00 PM on Day I. The final products will be judged at the night program of Day I. Cake decoration will be judged based on creativity, theme, cleanliness, (non-)waste of materials and cleanup.

BERACHOT BEE: Campers will be tested on the following berachot/tefillot:

Machzor Aleph – Al Hamichyah & Asher Yatzar

Machzor Bet – Al HaMichyah & Modim Derabanan

In addition, all divisions will given a list of foods for which to memorize the *bracha rishonah* and the *bracha achronah*. No partial credit will be given. The Berachot Bee will take place at 3:30 PM on Day II. Below are the locations for the Berachot Bee:

Machzor Aleph Boys Boys' Shul

Machzor Bet Boys Boys' Gym

Machzor Aleph Girls Pavilion

Machzor Bet Girls Tent on Campus

BUCKET BRIGADE: Each machzor will have a bucket brigade one day during Color War. Machzor Aleph will have the bucket brigade on Day I at 3:45 PM and Machzor Bet will have it at 3:30 PM on Day II. Machzor Aleph will walk to the Tisha B'av Site for the event after Team Time and a bus will take the boy's back after the event to Boys' Campus. A bus will take the Machzor Bet Boys from the Boys' H.C. to Tisha B'av Site at 3:25 PM on Day II. The bus will take them back to Boys' Campus after the event.

CHEER/STOMP & MASCOT: Each team will present a team cheer in the Mercazia at 8:00 PM on Day I following supper. The cheer should be to an exciting, upbeat tune and contain original lyrics. Points will be awarded for overall presentation, shtick, appeal of song (catchiness), creativity & originality, and camper participation. Musical accompaniment is permissible but not necessary. This summer, each cheer will also contain a stomp element to it. The placement and arrangement of the stomp within the cheer is up to the creativity of each team. Each team will also create a Team Mascot that will represent the team at the Cheer and for the rest of Color War. The cheer/stomp will be judged separately from the mascot. The mascot will be judged on choice of character, appearance of character, and presentation of character. On Day III, additional points will be awarded to the team whose cheer and mascot is most used during Color War. Jeremy Jozsef must approve the tune and lyrics of the cheer by Lunch of Day I. The shtick & stomp for the cheer and the mascot must also be approved by Jeremy Jozsef by the end of lunch of Day I.

DANCE: Girls Campus will present a dance presentation in the Mercazia following the theme presentation on the night of Day II. The dance presentation should represent your theme. The dance presentation is to last a maximum of four minutes, and include a minimum of 14 participants (Staff can be included). It will be judged on overall presentation, creativity, costumes, camper participation and choice of music. The dance presentation must be approved by Raquella Siegel by first shift breakfast on Day II. Each team must give the technical staff a recording of their music for the dance by dinner. Each team's music should be on a tape, CD, or iPod.

D'VAR TORAH: Each team will present one D'var Torah during Color War. All Divrei Torah must be submitted to Aaron Feigenbaum by lunch on Day I. The D'var Torah must be presented by a camper and may not exceed three minutes. It will be judged on the basis of content and presentation. The D'var Torah will be presented during dinner on Day I and Day II.

FISH-OFF: Two boys (1 O. Ilanot, 1 Alufim) and two girls (1 O. Ilanot, 1 Alufot) from each team will compete in the Fish-Off. A complete list of all participants must be submitted to Moshe Rosenberg by dinner on Day I. Points will be awarded based on type of fish and size of fish. A bonus will also be awarded to the team that catches the most overall fish. The Fish-Off will take place at 5:30 in the morning on Day II at the fishing dock. Boys will be picked up at their HC at precisely 5:15 AM; girls at 5:20 AM. Latecomers will not be allowed to compete.

MACCABIA: Alufim-Alufot and Machon will participate in a number of challenging races and competitions. Rosters for the races must be given Moshe Rosenberg by dinner on Day I.

MATMON SEFORIM: Each team will select three boys and three girls per division in Machzor Bet to compete. The Matmon will take place during Sheurim on Day II for Alufim-Alufot and on Day III for Ilanot in the library. All rules will be explained at the Matmon.

MBP - MISHNAYOT BEAL PEH: Each team will choose 3 boys and 3 girls (one from younger, and 2 from older Shilim for a total of 6). These campers will memorize and study five given Mishnayot relating to the theme. The judges will choose randomly 2 of the Mishnayot to be explained and recited. The testing will take place at 3:30 PM on Day III in the library. They will be tested for the Brachot Bee at that location as well. A list of the campers must be handed into Eli Cohn by Lunch of Day III.

RABBATON: Ilanot will be divided into five groups per team. Each group must be assigned a counselor. There should be a total of five counselors per team. Each group will be assigned Bondis at the start of the event. At each Bondi the group will have three minutes to complete an assigned task and then will have fifteen seconds to proceed to the next Bondi.

SHEALTIEL: The Shealtiel will consist of a set of questions based on material that will be distributed. Each team will select one boy and one girl per division, and one member of staff to compete. Shealtiel will take place on the night of Day II. A list of participants must be given to Eli Cohn by the end of Lunch on Day II.

STAFF GAMES: There will be boys and girls staff basketball games on Day I at 10:45 PM in the New Gym and on Girls Courts. On Day II, there will be a Men's' hockey game on the Boys' Courts and a Women's volleyball game on the Girls' Courts. Only those staff members that have participated or will participate in a Morashia event (e.g. coaching a game or working on art) will be allowed to play in the staff game. There will be severe point deductions for any team that does not adhere to this rule.

THEME PRESENTATION: Each team will present its theme in an audio-video presentation that is to last a maximum of six minutes. No introduction is allowed; the entire presentation must be pre-recorded and will be coordinated by David Goldfischer out of the Tech Office in the A Building. The theme will be judged on development of theme, creativity, and professionalism. The presentation may not include specific references to any staff member or camper. Each team's theme coordinator(s) must attend a meeting with David Goldfischer at 10:05 AM on Day I in the Technical office to discuss procedures for filming, editing, and equipment use. The presentation's concept and script must be approved by David Goldfischer by breakfast on Day II and will be presented on the night of Day II in the Mercazia.

II. ART PROJECTS

Nitzanim Tzedaka Box

A wooden tzedaka box will be provided to each team. Nitzanim will creatively design and decorate the boxes, which will be placed in the Boys' Shul and Pavilion. The tzedaka boxes should be sanded before painting or decorating. Decorating materials include only tile, paper mosaic, and/or paint. All materials should be attached with mod podge glue. The project must be approved by **Shulamith Cohn** by Dinner of Day I and completed by 5:40 PM of Day III. This project may only be worked on by Nitzanim campers. Failure to comply by this rule will result in an automatic 50-point penalty. This project will be judged on:

1. Creativity
2. Aesthetic appearance
3. Durability

Wash & Bench Shtilim Project

The Shtilim will be responsible for completing two projects:

1. **Wash:** Wouldn't it be great if everyone knew if they had to wash for a meal before they sat down? Shtilim to the rescue! Each team will create a sign to notify the camp whether or not the meal requires washing for bread. An 8" x 18" piece of wood will be given to each team with a hinged wooden flap in the center. When the flap is in the closed position, the sign should clearly inform the camp to wash in a creative way. The board should also have a creative design for when the flap is open. Magnets will be provided to each team in order to keep the flaps open and closed. Paint should be the only medium and no other material should be used for decorating the board. The wood must be sanded before any painting is done. The sketch for the signs must be approved by **Sara Lamm Dratch** by Dinner of Day I and completed by 5:40 PM of Day III. This project may only be worked on by Shtili campers. Failure to comply by this rule will result in an automatic 50-point penalty. This project will be judged on:



1. Aesthetic appearance
2. Usefulness & Clarity of Wording
3. Creativity & Originality

2. **Bench:** Each team will be also be given two wooden benches to sand and paint. The benches will be placed outside the canteen and should be painted in a creative and fun fashion. Each bench must be sanded and primed before painting and varnished upon completion. The sketch for the signs must be approved by **Jenni Levin** by Lunch of Day I and completed by 5:40 PM of Day III. This project may only be worked on by Shtili campers. Failure to comply by this rule will result in an automatic 50-point penalty. This project will be judged on:

1. Creativity
2. Aesthetic appearance
3. Durability

Y. Ilanot Campus Signs

A 3 foot x 4 foot piece of 1/2 inch plywood will be given to each team in order to create a creative sign representing Boys' and Girls' campus. Each team must sand and prime the board before painting the sign. The signs should reflect the unique character of the campus and should clearly identify the campus name. The signs may be cut into a specific shape. The Ari team will be responsible for the Girls' Campus sign while the Tzvi team will be responsible for the Boys' Campus sign. Signs must be varnished upon completion. The sketch for the signs must be approved by **Nummy Kimmel** by Dinner of Day I and completed by 5:40 PM of Day

III. This project may only be worked on by Y. Ilanot campers. Failure to comply by this rule will result in an automatic 50-point penalty. This project will be judged on:

1. Creativity
2. Aesthetic appearance
3. Durability
4. Appropriateness as a Welcome to Campus sign
5. Ability to read and understand the sign

O. Ilanot Street Sign Project

Each team will be given three 8-foot wooden posts upon which they will make creative directional street signs. The signs will point to various key destinations in camp to aid visitors in navigating the campgrounds. The teams will be responsible for cutting and painting the wood and should do so in a fun and creative fashion. The design for this project must be done ONLY by O. Ilanot campers. Failure to comply by this rule will result in an automatic 50-point penalty. The design and idea must be approved by **Dov Emerson** by Dinner of Day I. The completed project, including varnishing, must be ready by 5:40 PM of Day III. Only paint is permitted on the signs and the design need not be based on your team theme. No gluing of any material is allowed. The signs will be judged on:

1. Creativity
2. Aesthetic appearance
3. Ability to read and understand the sign
4. Durability

The Ari team will be responsible for Boys' Campus signs to be posted at the following three locations: (1) Entrance to Boys' Campus (By London House) (2) Specialty Boys' Bunk (3) Infirmary. The Tzvi team will be responsible for Girls' Campus signs to be posted at the following three locations: (1) A Building (2) Girls' Yachad Bunk (3) Mercazia Stairs. Each team will determine what signs are needed for each post.

Alufim/fot Bulletin Board Project

Each team will receive one 7 foot x 5 foot piece of 1/2 inch plywood, 1/4 inch luan board, and a roll of cork. Each team will design a beautiful and informative board to be hung on either side of the dining room. The boards should be sanded and primed before any painting is done. Your creative interpretation can range from wacky and fun to elegant and formal. Your board may be 3-dimensional but may not exceed 1" in depth nor have any moving parts. The cork should be applied to and comprise most of your board. The cork and board should be painted and all items must be applied with durability in mind. Paint should be the only medium and no other material should be used for decorating the board. The 1/2 inch plywood is your base and the 1/4 inch luan is for applied designs. The sketch for the signs must be approved by **Rena Emerson** by Lunch of Day I and completed by 5:40 PM of Day III. This project may only be worked on by Alufim/fot campers. Failure to comply by this rule will result in an automatic 50-point penalty. This project will be judged on:

1. Creativity
2. Aesthetic appearance
3. Durability
4. Usefulness as a Bulletin Board

Camp Project: Canteen Kit

The camp project is open for any team member to work on (staff or camper). This year's camp project will consist of two parts:

- **Table:** Each team will receive a table from the canteen to mosaic using ceramic tiles to be hand-painted and fired in the kiln. These tiles will comprise the majority of the table and can be combined with small pieces of mosaic tile and paint. All tiles must be adhered to and grouted onto the table. The table need not be theme related. The legs of the table should also be decorated in a creative way using either paint, decoupage, or mosaic. The sketch for the tables must be approved by **Chaye Lamm Warburg** by Lunch of Day I and completed with grout by 5:40 PM of Day III. The painting on the tiles must be completed by the end of Day I and brought to the

Ceramics Room for firing in the kiln. They will be returned in the morning of Day III for adhering to and grouting onto the table.

- **Clock:** Each team will be responsible for creating a clock for the canteen. A 24" x 24" piece of wood will be given to each team. The board can be cut into whatever shape you would like, as long as it is no smaller than 18" x 18". We will also supply the hands for the clock that will run on battery. Each team must think of a creative and striking design for the clock. Be creative! The sign could reflect what the Canteen sells or simply be a jazzy or eye-catching clock to draw people into the canteen. It should only be decorated with paint and does not have to be theme related. Sketches and ideas for the clock must be approved by **Leba Grauer** by dinner of Day I and should be varnished and ready to be mounted by 5:40 PM of Day III.

The Canteen Kit will be judged as a unit and should have a unified theme for both projects. The kit will be judged on the project's aesthetic appearance, creativity & originality, durability, and usability.

Shelet:

The shelet should embody symbols associated with the themes of the teams in a creative, original, and striking way. The shelet will be designed and built on a piece of wood no larger than 8'x4' and no smaller than 4'x4.' The shelet can be three-dimensional but may not exceed 3" in depth.

The Shelet Committee from each team will meet with Sandy Weiner, Jeremy Jozsef, and Aaron Feigenbaum during the morning of Day I to discuss theme presentation, different media available, recommended material, and an orderly work schedule. The Shelet Committee should come to these meetings with several ideas and sketches ready in the event that one is not practical, materials are not available or the idea is not time efficient. The meetings will take place according to the following schedule:

Tzvi (Girls' Art Room): 10:30 AM

Ari (Pargod): 11:15 AM

A final sketch must be approved by Sandy Weiner by dinner of Day I. Any changes made to this original sketch must be approved with Sandy. PLEASE MAKE SURE YOU REVIEW ALL RULES WITH YOUR GENERALS BEFORE YOU BEGIN BUILDING YOUR PROJECTS. You must keep in mind that the Shield will be judged as a display. NO SHIELD MAY CONTAIN ANY MOVING PARTS. Creativity and originality of design and concept will comprise a large percentage of the points earned for the shelet. The Shield will be judged on the basis of the following:

1. Artistic appeal
2. Quality of workmanship
3. Representation of theme
4. Originality of concept
5. Durability
6. Appropriateness
7. Presentation. The presentation is to consist of a detailed and creative explanation of the shelet and how it relates to the theme. It may not exceed 3 minutes in length.

The shelet will be presented on the night of Day III in the Mercazia.

III. SHIRIA

Each Team will present two songs. The songs will be judged on the basis of clarity and precision, harmony and arrangements, knowledge of words and overall participation. ALL SONGS AND ARRANGEMENTS MUST BE APPROVED IN ADVANCE OF TEACHING by Ari Yablok by the end of breakfast – Day II. For complete instructions, please see attachment. All Shiriah shtick, including stand-ups, must be approved by Jeremy Jozsef by dinner on Day III.

SONG 1: Theme-based Selection

Each team will choose a song that they feel embodies the theme of their team. Songs may be either fast, moderate, or slow in rhythm. Even though the team name itself may not appear in the song, the lyrics of the song must have some connection to the broader theme & understanding of the team name. Shiria leaders are responsible to compose their own harmonies with assistance of the Music Department. The song selection must be approved by Ari Yablok by Breakfast of Day II.

The music staff is there to assist in the development of the song but will not initiate harmonies and arrangements. This is the primary responsibility of the leaders assigned to Shiria by their teams.

The song will be judged on:

1. Clarity & Precision
Do the voices blend and are the words sound in such a fashion as to be easily recognized? If there a clear division between the melody & harmony? Is there "singing" or "screaming?"
2. Arrangements
The layout of the song's presentation. How many creative uses did the team find in presenting the song (Solos, acapella, readings, repetition, modulations, use of dynamics, volume changes, creative intros, creative endings...)
3. Original Harmonies
4. Connection to team's theme
5. Overall performance

SONG 2: Camp Song

As the summer comes to an end, we look forward to hearing each team's Camp Song—a song written by each team, reflecting on the Camp Morasha experience in conjunction with their respective Color War theme. What does the Camp Morasha mean to you, what does your Color War theme mean to you, and is there any connection between the two? This song should be powerful and sentimental. The song selection must be approved by Ari Yablok by Breakfast of Day II and the lyrics must be approved by Yael Goldfischer by Breakfast of Day II.

The music staff is there to assist in the development of the song but will not initiate harmonies and arrangements. This is the primary responsibility of the leaders assigned to Shiria by their teams. The song will be judged on:

1. Clarity & Percision
Do the voices blend and are the words sund in such a fashion as to be easily recognized? If there a clear division between the melody & harmony? Is there "singing" or "screaming?"
2. Arrangements
The layout of the song's presentation. How many creative uses did the team find in presenting the song (Solos, acapella, readings, repetition, modulations, use of dynamics, volume changes, creative intros, creative endings...)
3. Original Harmonies
4. Lyrics
5. Overall performance

It goes without saying that each team should be careful to adhere to the halachic standards of our camp throughout the Color War experience.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR COUNSELORS

COUNSELORS MUST FIRST FULFILL THEIR RESPONSIBILITIES TO THEIR BUNKS – AS PER INSTRUCTIONS FROM HCs AND DHs - BEFORE PROCEEDING TO MORASHIA EVENTS.

It is the major duty of all counselors and generals to encourage all work to be done by campers. Counselors are to serve primarily as advisors.

Sportsmanship: Stress is not on competition but on emphasis of the themes delineated and sportsmanship. All activities should be conducted with the spirit of good fellowship. To win is not as important as to compete to the best of your ability. Therefore, all counselors are requested to make certain that all campers, no matter how weak in athletics, shall participate. Individual judges may recommend an award or deduction of up to five (5) points per incident for attitude, spirit, sportsmanship, supervision etc.

Discussions and protests of controversial decisions should never be held in the presence of campers.

Bunk Clean-Up Schedule: Bunk inspection will be done by the division heads or head counselors. Points may be deducted at the discretion of the inspector.

Coverage: Bunks MUST be covered during the morning cleanup, rest hour, evening preparation and bedtime. Responsibility for this coverage will be divided among the teams such that each team will be responsible for a set number of bunks. A list of the covering counselors is to be presented to the Coordinating Committee each evening by 10:30 PM. Severe deductions will be made for any bunk left uncovered.

Tefilah: In the Bet Knesset, campers and counselors will sit by bunk. Baalei Tefila will be chosen according to the regular rotation. No camper or counselor may absent himself/herself from Tefila.

Structure of the Teams: Each team is required to designate coordinators in the areas of Art, Sports, Chinuch, and Swimming. There must be machzor coordinators for sports and swim.

GENERAL RULES

All generals, staff members, & campers must remember to have fun!

Wake Up: Each team will be responsible for waking up the camp on specific days. Below is the schedule of when each team is "on" for wake up. Wake up is at 7:15 each morning. Penalties of up to 100 points will be assessed for failure to wake up the campuses on time.

Curfew: CAMPERS & COUNSELORS ARE NOT PERMITTED TO STAY UP AFTER CURFEW, NOR ARE THEY TO ARISE BEFORE REVEILLE, WITHOUT SPECIAL PERMISSION FROM THE HEAD COUNSELORS & THE COORDINATING COMMITTEE. A limited number of campers and counselors may be allowed an extended curfew. Their names MUST be submitted on a special curfew extension form to the Coordinating Committee by 7:30 PM. Names should be listed in order of preference. Extended curfews will be until 12:00 AM for a total of four O. Ilanot campers & four Alufim/fot campers per team. Lieutenants have a 12:00 AM curfew. A total amount of five staff members per team may have an extended curfew until 2:00 AM. All 4 generals will have an automatic 2:00 AM curfew.

Entries: Complete written lists of starting and substitute players in games must be submitted to the judges before the start of the game. If entries are not submitted on time, the event may be forfeited at the discretion of the judges. Entries may be changed only upon the consent of the judges. Any camper may be barred from participation in events by the medical staff.

Scores: Judges should submit scores to a member of the Scoring or the Coordinating Committee at the conclusion of each activity. Where no judge is assigned, the team responsible for equipment is also responsible for scores.

Dining Room: General decorum must be maintained and the teams will be judged accordingly. All generals must be at each meal. The team bases will be closed during all meals and no camper, counselor or General is to be absent from any meal without the prior permission of the Head Counselor & Coordinating Committee. Failure to comply with result in a deduction of points.

O.D.: The O.D. schedule will follow regular rotation. Generals may make substitutions only with permission of the Head Counselors.

Changes: All activities, rules and regulations are subject to change without prior notice at the discretion of the Coordinating Committee. This will be done only if unusual circumstances indicate the necessity for such a change.

Prorating: A modified prorating system (Olympic scoring) will be used for all sports except where otherwise noted. 20% of the points will go to the winner. The remainder of the points will be divided on a percent basis. In general, the following will be the total point value for each sport: In case of shut-outs, or wide point differences, certain adjustments are made in the prorating system. The Scoring Committee may be consulted for details.

Protests: Protests must be submitted in writing, signed by the counselors supervising the activity, and countersigned by the General. The protest is to be submitted to Eli Cohn by the mealtime immediately following the event in question.

Preparation & Promptness: Teams must report to activities promptly. Failure to be prompt may lead to the forfeiture of points. All campers in the division must be present at the activity of their division (unless the camper is taking part in another supervised activity). Participants should wear, wherever and whenever possible, the team color.

Supply Runs: There will be supply runs by a camp driver daily: One on Day I, two on Day II and one on Day III. Supply lists, signed by a general, must be handed in to Sandy Weiner or Jeremy Jozef for approval by breakfast and lunch each day. They will then hand the lists over to the driver for pick-up. **Private cars may not be used to acquire supplies.** Supplies will be distributed only to a general. Below is a schedule for shuttle runs and when the supply request forms are due:

ART RULES

- The Tzvi team is assigned to the Art Room while the Ari team is assigned to the Pargod for all projects and Morashia preparations.
- All work, other than wood-cuttings, should be done in the Art Room or Pargod.
- Campers cannot miss any shiurim, meals, night activities, or sports activities to work on their divisional projects. They may work on projects during clean up, rest, preparation, team times (2 per division), bucket brigade (2 per division), swim meet (2 per division), and the brachot bee. The Coordinating Committee will grant special permission for

campers to miss sports activities upon request on a need-basis. Failure to adhere to these rules will result in a loss of points.

- Supplies must be requested from Jeremy Jozsef or Sandy Weiner by breakfast and lunch each day of Color War (See above). As supplies become available, they will be supplied to each team.
- Each project has a specific advisor. No work may be done on any project without the approval of the advisor specified for that project.
- The art rooms will be locked each night at 2:00 AM. No one is allowed in the art rooms past this time! Points will be deducted for any person found in an art room past 2:00 AM.
- Both teams will be responsible for their art room, keeping it clean and maintaining the condition of all tools and equipment. The art rooms will be inspected at 7:00 PM of Day III. Points will be deducted for any graffiti or rooms not properly cleaned.
- Generals will appoint Project Coordinators for each Color War project. For divisional projects, the coordinator should be a counselor from that division. That counselor should choose the campers that will work on the divisional project. **ONLY CAMPERS FROM THE APPROPRIATE DIVISIONS MAY WORK ON THE DIVISIONAL PROJECTS!** Points will be deducted if staff members work on divisional projects!
- Project Coordinators should meet with their group to come up with ideas and make preliminary sketches. Several different approaches should be explored and presented to the project advisor.
- All projects **MUST BE COMPLETED AND VARNISHED** (if necessary) by their specified time. The projects must be ready to be picked up from warehouse at their specified time on Day III.
- All Hebrew spelling and choice of wording must be approved by Aaron Feigenbaum before used!!!
