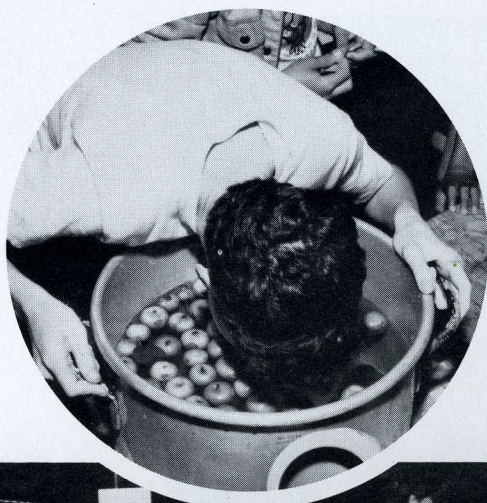

One Sunday at Camp Morasha was devoted to a "one day Morashia" based on the theme **יום הקמת המשכן** the day when the **משכן** was erected. Each team was assigned certain projects dealing with the central theme, and had to construct a model of a given **כלי** or vessel, which was used in the **משכן** and to present skits, songs, and decorations which dealt with chosen and historical episodes. Because the campers only had one day to work on these projects, they were judged not on the basis of artistic perfection, but on the bases of accuracy of design and relevance to the theme, which were a measure of the teams' understanding of the meaning of **יום**

קמת המשכן.

Because all work had to be completed on Sunday, Camp Morasha was the scene of feverish activity throughout the day. The library was filled with campers studying those parts of the **תורה** dealing with **יום הקמה** and groups were crowded around those books that had diagrams of the **כלים** used in the **משכן**. At the same time, others were eagerly researching the theme for the skit and song presentations. And still other campers were testing their ingenuity as they collected materials which could be used in the actual construction of the models of the **כלים** used in the **משכן**. The bustling activity was even not stopped by the sudden rainstorm which sent busy campers scurrying for cover.

The purpose of programs such as **יום הקמת המשכן** is to help us realize how much really can be accomplished in one day if we put our minds to it. The day's program also instilled everyone with a spirit of cooperation, because each camper had to conscientiously do his part if the entire program was to be completed in one day. Everyone who participated was thrilled to watch the presentations during Sunday's night activity, because they showed how each individual's part contributed to the final team effort. 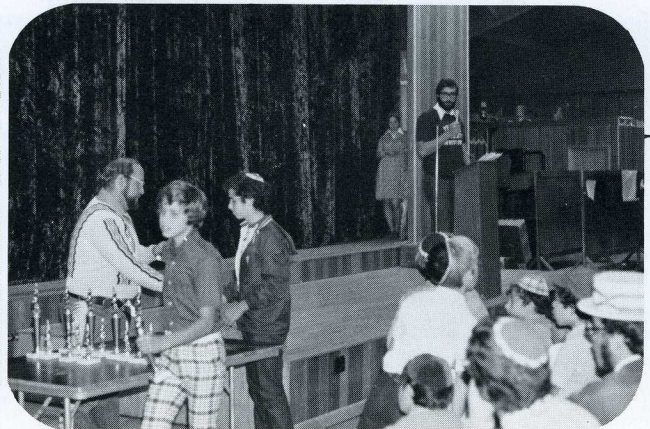

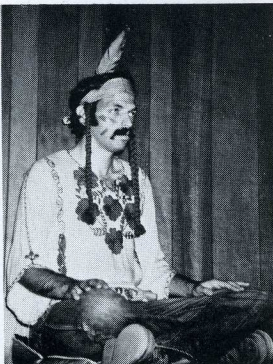

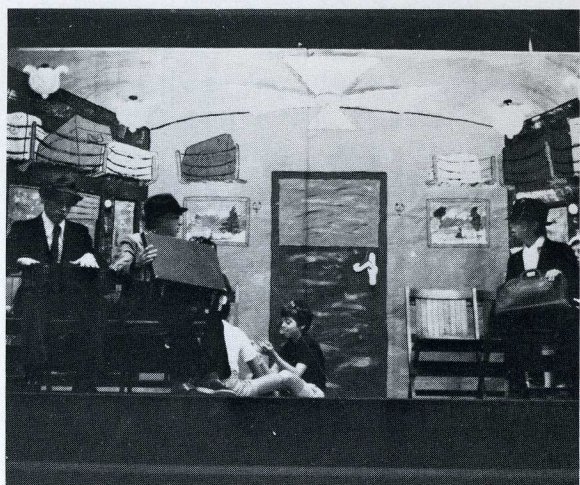

ROVING REPORT

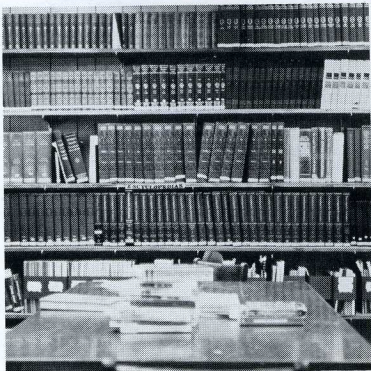

Consider for a moment the following statistics which describe our community's voracious appetite. Among other things, each week 12,400 slices of bread are eaten in addition to challah on Shabbat & breakfast rolls, washed down with 3800 quarts of milk, which accounts for the 21,000 paper cups used weekly. For suppers, we usually eat 1650 pounds of chicken and about 2000 pounds of meat weekly. We must not forget the 10,800 eggs the kitchen prepares weekly. If, perchance, the chef should decide to prepare french fries for one night, he will have to count out 19,200 fries to make sure that everyone gets enough. To add the sweet touch to all this, 1,000 pounds of sugar are used weekly. The fact that we use up 32,000 napkins is a tribute to our community's exemplary table manners.

This year, the responsibility for running this massive operation rests on the shoulders of Mr. Keller, who supervises a kitchen staff of about forty and is constantly busy with his work, much of which must be done well before the camp season opens.

During the camp season, Mr. Keller feels that his most important job is to make sure that high sanitary standards are maintained and that there are enough supplies available to provide all the ingredients for which the menu calls. He must be careful not to order more or less than is needed. This requires that a careful inventory be kept of everything in the stockroom.

Mr. Keller is quick to point out that his job is possible only because of the cooperation of the entire kitchen staff.

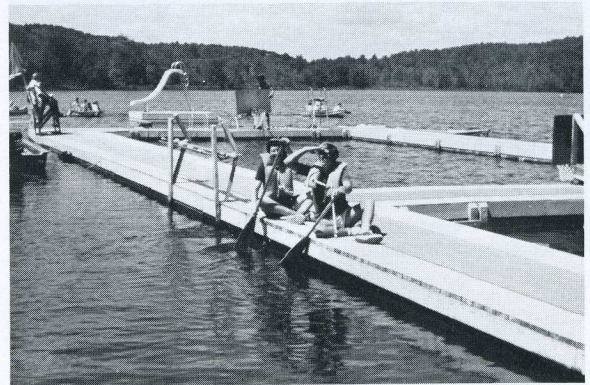
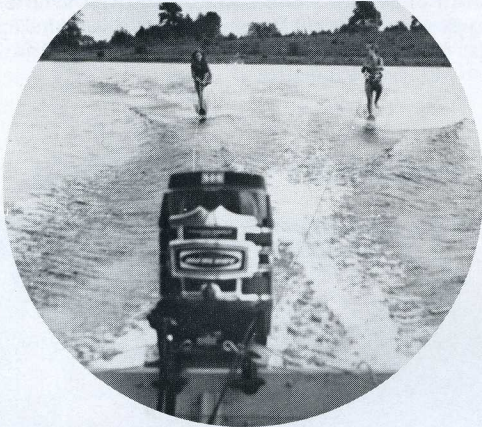
